This art exhibition by the Picturemakers continues for a further few weeks. It's a very popular exhibition and well worth a visit.



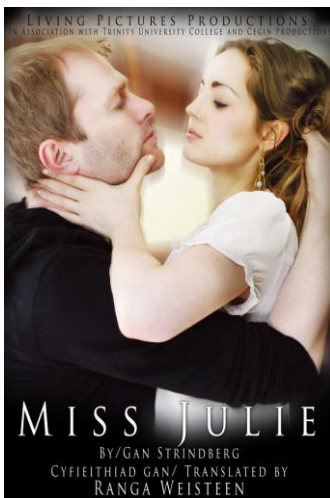
### **A TALK BY SUE JONES-DAVIES: "CENSORSHIP OF ABERYSTWYTH FILMS"**
