### **E-BULLETIN: 14 AUGUST 2008**

It's hard to believe we're in the middle of August since, as I'm writing this e-bulletin, the rain is beating against the window.

It's been extremely busy here this week with the Evangelical Movement of Wales' **Book Fair** and **Missions Exhibition** and hoards of people calling by each day. Once again, it is fascinating to see how the Hall is transformed for yet another different event, and the next few weeks will bring a further variety of events to Morlan.

- A **Harp Workshop** led by Bill Taylor will be held in the Hall on Saturday and Sunday, 23-24 August.
- On Tuesday, 26 August, Mark Williams, our MP will be holding his **Surgery** in the Committee Room, between 10.00 and 12.30.
- That afternoon will see the return of one our 'regulars' following their summer break, when the local branch of **WYFSD (Welsh Youth Forum on Sustainable Development)** will meet here at 5 o'clock in the Committee Room. I understand that their numbers have dwindled slightly recently, so if you know of any young person who would relish the opportunity to contribute to the work of this organisation, send them over. - Another workshop will take place in the Hall Saturday, 30 August but, in complete contrast to the previous weekend, this one will be a **Ceramic Painting Workshop**.
- On Saturday, 27 September, Troed y Rhiw Co-operative Theatre Group will be performing Saunders Lewis' play **Blodeuwedd** at 7.30. Tickets will cost £6 (£4 concession). Following the play the cast and crew will be available to discuss the play over a cup of tea/coffee.
- Then on Monday, 29 September we will be welcoming Professor Gareth Wyn Jones, Bangor to speak on the topic "*Tsunamis Large and Small*" as part of the **Dweud ei Ddweud** (Having his Say) series. The evening starts at 7.30.
- During September, we will have an **exhibition of photographs** in the foyer as part of Hafal's **Have you clicked?** campaign. Hafal is an organisation for people with serious mental illness and this campaign aims to provide people across Wales with information in an attempt to combat stigma. The campaign has a photographic element in order to break down barriers and encourage people to have fun. Hafal clients and carers across Wales – as well as members of the public – have been given the opportunity to use digital equipment to capture an image that says something about their lives. Photographic images from across the country will be collected and exhibitions will take place in all the Welsh counties (including one at Morlan), as well as national exhibitions at venues such as the National Assembly.
